While in Delaware, he was elected to the Executive Committee of the Delaware State Bar Association and was appointed by the Governor to the Governor's Advisory Council for Hispanic Affairs. He went on to become a partner in the Houston trial firm of Berg & Androphy, then joined Bienert, Miller & Katzman as of counsel in September 2008. Mr. Feldstein is a member of the Bars of California, Delaware, Texas and Washington, D.C.

Before entering the law, Mr. Feldstein spent 10 years as an award-winning investigative reporter, editor and columnist for The Miami Herald, where his articles led to the resignations and/or indictments of numerous public officials, and his post-Hurricane Andrew series on the building practices of leading homebuilders helped win the Pulitzer Prize Gold Medal for Outstanding Public Service. Mr. Feldstein appeared regularly on television and radio news shows and moderated numerous candidate debates during his time in Miami.
